**Subject: Submittal of the San Joaquin Council of Governments Amendment #11 to the 2017 Federal Transportation Improvement Program**

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Dear Mr. Aljabiry,

Enclosed for your review and approval is Amendment #11 to the 2017 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (2017 FTIP). Amendment #11 is a Type 3 Formal Amendment to the 2017 FTIP. Amendment #11 makes necessary funding changes to the existing projects and programs new projects as indicated in the attached documentation. The proposed project changes have been determined to be exempt from the requirement that a conformity determination and/or regional emissions analysis be performed per 40 CFR 93.126, 93.127, or 93.128. Because the projects are exempt, no further conformity determination is required. In addition, the projects and/or project phases contained in Amendment #11 do not interfere with the timely implementation of any approved Transportation Control Measures (TCMs). The 2017 FTIP meets all applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 CFR Part 450 and 40 CFR Part 93. The projects included in this amendment are not in common with any other amendment currently open for public comment or being processed.

A seven-day public review period for Amendment #11 commenced on June 15, 2017 and concluded on June 22, 2017. The public participation process for Amendment #11 to the 2017 FTIP is consistent with San Joaquin Council of Governments board adopted Public Participation Plan. On June 22, 2017, the San Joaquin Council of Governments Board of Directors approved Amendment #11 by resolution R-17-36. State and Federal approval is required for Amendment #11 to the 2017 FTIP.

# STAFF REPORT

**SUBJECT:** 2017 Federal Transportation  
Improvement Program (Type 3)  
Amendment #11

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:** (1) Approve Formal Amendment #11  
to the 2017 Federal Transportation  
Improvement Program; and  
(2) Adopt Resolution R-17-36

## SUMMARY:

Every Federal transportation dollar in San Joaquin must be identified in the San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) before the funds can be expended. The FTIP is the four-year capital improvement program that provides any agency receiving the federal funding the authority to move forward to seek approval to expend the funds. If a project is not identified in the FTIP, an amendment to the plan is needed. There are different “types” of amendments, depending on the change proposed.

Amendment #11 is a Type 3 amendment which adds projects that are exempt from conformity into the FTIP. The amendment would add seven new listings. Notations in CTIPS for the 2017 FTIP are added as follows:

- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0717: Grouped Projects for Operating Assistance to Transit Agencies - FTA 5310: adds new grouped listing with \$360,894 of FTA 5310 funds annually in FY 2016/17 through FY 2019/20.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0718: Grouped Projects for Purchase of New or Replacement Buses - FTA 5310: adds new grouped listing with \$483,000 of FTA 5310 funds annually in FY 2016/17 through FY 2019/20.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0719: Miner Avenue Complete Street – Phase 2: adds new listing, including \$670,000 of ATP funds in FY 19/20.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0720: Citywide Bicycle Facilities Detection Improvement Project: adds new listing, including \$15,000 of City Funds in FY 16/17, \$45,000 of City Funds in FY 17/18, \$58,000 of City Funds in FY 19/20, and \$447,000 of ATP funds in FY 19/20.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0721: Lowell Avenue Sidewalk Construction Project: adds new listing, including \$33,000 of City Funds in FY 17/18, \$63,000 of City Funds in FY 19/20, and \$232,000 of ATP funds in FY 19/20.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0722: RTD’s Bike and Bus Transportation Project: adds new listing, including \$120,000 of Measure K funds and \$152,000 of ATP funds in FY 19/20.

- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0723: FTA 5339 Bus Replacements adds new listing, including \$2,100,000 of Measure K Funds and \$8,284,000 of FTA 5339 funds in FY 17/18.

The details behind the amendment can be found at [www.sjco.org/ftip](http://www.sjco.org/ftip) which was posted for the required seven day review period.

The changes made by Amendment #11 do not interfere with the conformity analysis years as assumed for the regional emissions analysis of the currently conformed and amended 2014 RTP and 2017 FTIP. The cost changes for these projects do not interfere with the timely implementation of any approved Transportation Control Measures (TCMs). The 2017 FTIP as amended meets all the applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 450.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

SJCOG staff is recommending the SJCOG Board approve FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 to the 2017 FTIP and Adopt Resolution R-17-36.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Approval of the SJCOG staff recommendation would allow four Active Transportation Program projects and several transit projects to move forward. In total, these adjustments amounts to a total of increase of \$15,594,576 over the four year FTIP period (FY 2016/17 – FY 19/20).

### **BACKGROUND:**

The Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) is a financially constrained transportation programming document developed by SJCOG through its member agencies and in cooperation with State and Federal agencies and the eight San Joaquin Valley counties.

The premise behind an FTIP is that it serves as the incremental implementation (four years) of the long-range Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The FTIP also serves to present federal funding agencies with manageable components to fund the long-range plan. If any amendments made to the FTIP cause a change in the financial element, it is required that a revised financial plan be open to public comment. SJCOG is proposing a Type 3 amendment to the 2017 FTIP (FY 2016/17 – FY 19/20). This amendment consists of the addition of new projects exempt from Air Quality Conformity.

### **PUBLIC INPUT:**

SJCOG posted the amendment documentation on the SJCOG website on June 15, 2017 at [www.sjco.org](http://www.sjco.org). Comments can be accepted on the FTIP Amendment #11 until 12:00 pm on June 22, 2017. The SJCOG Board is anticipated to take action on Amendment #11 at the June 22, 2017 meeting. State and Federal approval of this amendment is required.

### **RESOLUTION APPROVING (TYPE 3) AMENDMENT #11 TO THE 2017 FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (FTIP)**

WHEREAS, the San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) is a Regional Transportation Planning Agency and a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), pursuant to State and Federal designation; and

WHEREAS, federal planning regulations require MPOs to prepare and adopt a long range Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) for their region; and

WHEREAS, federal planning regulations require that MPOs prepare, adopt, and maintain a Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) for their region; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 Federal Transportation Improvement Program Amendment #11 (2017 FTIP Amendment #11) has been prepared to comply with Federal and State requirements for local projects and through a cooperative process between the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), the State Department of Transportation (Caltrans), principal elected officials of general purpose local governments and their staffs, and public owner operators of mass transportation services acting through the SJCOG forum and general public involvement; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 program listing is consistent with: 1) the 2014 Regional Transportation Plan; 2) the 2016 State Transportation Improvement Program; and 3) the Corresponding Conformity Analysis; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 contains the MPO's certification of the transportation planning process assuring that all federal requirements have been fulfilled; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 meets all applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 CFR Part 450.

WHEREAS, projects submitted in the 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 must be financially constrained and the financial plan affirms that funding is available; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 is consistent with the adopted Conformity Analysis for the 2017 FTIP and the 2014 RTP; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 does not interfere with the timely implementation of the Transportation Control Measures; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11 conforms to the applicable SIPs; and

WHEREAS, a 7-day public review process occurred from June 15, 2017 to June 22, 2017 consistent with the SJCOG adopted Public Participation Plan.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the SJCOG approves the formal 2017 FTIP (Type 3) Amendment #11; and
