Subject: Administrative Modification #9 to the 2019 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP)

Dear Mr. Aljabiry,

Please be advised that the San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOC) made changes to the 2019 FTIP. The SJCOC Executive Director has the authority to approve all administrative modifications. The proposed modifications are consistent with the 2018 Regional Transportation Plan (as amended) and Public Participation Plan (as amended) adopted by the SJCOC Board of Directors. SJCOC FTIP Administrative Modification #8 amends the costs to the following projects in the 2019 FTIP:

- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0001: Grouped Projects for Pavement Resurfacing and or Rehabilitation – adjusts backup listing to reflect current project understanding. Decreases RSTP funds by \$400,000 in FY 20/21. Increases RSTP funds by \$383,998 in FY 21/22.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0403: Grouped Projects for Safety Improvements - HSIP – adjusts listing to match current Caltrans backup listing. Resulting increase of HSIP funds by \$628,990 in FY 19/20 and Local Transportation Funds by \$162,070 in FY 20/21. Decreases HSIP funds by \$250,00 in FY 21/22 and Local Funds by \$796,590 in FY 19/10 and \$1,761,740 in FY 21/22.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0432: Grouped Projects for Bridge Rehabilitation and Reconstruction – SHOPP Program – adjusts listing for three projects, with increase of \$3,044,000 in FY 18/19 and \$5,424,000 in FY 19/20 of SHOPP AC funds.
- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0667: Grouped Projects for Safety Improvements – SHOPP Mobility Program – adjusts listing for one project, with decrease of \$7,000 in FY 18/19 and increase of \$2,220,000 in FY 19/20 of SHOPP AC funds.

SJCOG 2019 FTIP Amendment #9

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- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0716: McHenry Avenue Widening – Shifts CON Phase from FY 18/19 to FY 20/21. Adjusts funding with resulting decrease of \$200,000 of RSTP funds and \$200,000 of City Funds in FY 18/19, and increase of \$559,999 of RSTP funds in FY 20/21.

In addition, the Implementing Agency for the following project has been changed from the City of Ripon to the San Joaquin Regional Transit District:

- CTIPS ID 212-0000-0740: Ripon Multimodal Station

In addition, for your information SJCOG has made a technical correction to the Regionally Significant Project List contained within the 2018 Regional Transportation Plan. The “I-5 Stockton Channel Viaduct” project (operations and maintenance category) had inadvertently been omitted from the project list, despite being correctly modeled in SJCOG’s travel demand model and conformity analysis. Thus, its entry into the Regionally Significant Project List would be considered a technical correction, as it has already been accurately evaluated for air quality conformity.

With the modifications identified in this document, the SJCOG 2019 FTIP remains financially constrained. SJCOG certifies that this modification contains exempt projects and does not require a conformity re-determination. SJCOG also certifies that this modification does not impact the timely implementation of any TCMs and that no project included in this modification is included in any other amendment or modification to the FTIP currently out for public review or approval.


